

Animal A to Z


What will I need?

- Paper
- Colouring pencils or pens



What do I do?

- 1. Divide your paper so that it has 5 columns and 5 rows. That will create 25 boxes. As there are 26 letters in the alphabet, you can create one extra space by dividing the last box in two.
