



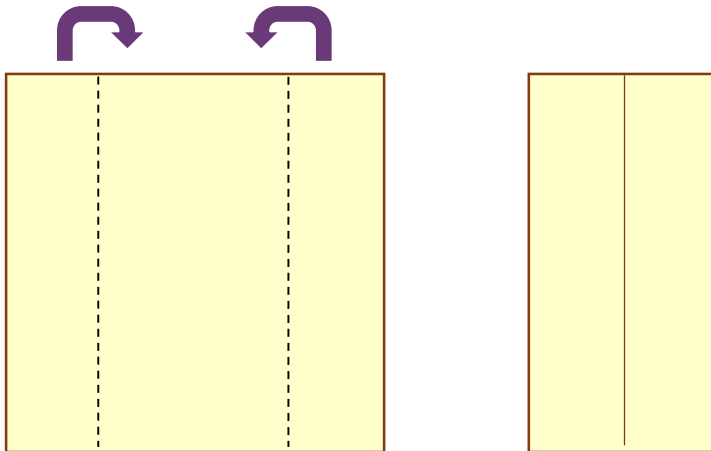
A Doorway into the Museum

What will I need?

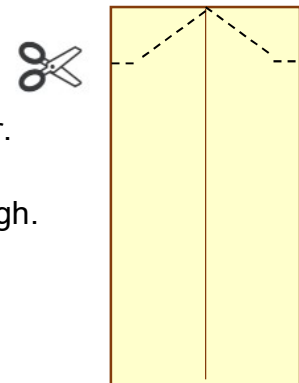
- Pencil
- Thick cardboard
- Paint
- A paintbrush
- Scissors

What do I do?

1. You'll need to start with a square piece of card. Fold the two sides in so they meet in the middle. If you're using thick card, you may need to ask an adult to score a line along the fold, so that the sides flat:



2. You can leave it there for a regular doorway, or you can cut away part of the top for something slightly fancier. This can be a bit tricky though and you might need some adult help, as there will be two layers of card to cut through.





3. Our piece of card looked like this once it was opened back out...



4. With the sides folded over, imagine they are a pair of doors. You can then draw or paint your entrance. We used a few shades of brown for the stone pillars, black pen to outline different parts and white to add detail to the dark doors.



5. Once you are happy with the outside, open up the card and draw the objects you would like inside your museum. We wanted to recreate Ipswich Museum, so sketched a giraffe, gorillas a rhino and our woolly mammoth!



6. Now it's time to colour in your exhibits! We kept ours close to the real thing, but you can always experiment!
